











Mosses of Missouri Through a Hand Lens Book Corrections

Page 40: *Atrichum* genus reference page should be 322, and not 332.

 <p>9a</p>	<p>9a (8) Moss resembles a palm tree with branches coming off of distal half of erect stipe, leaves ovate with concolorous and denticulate apex</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Climacium</i> page 145</p>
 <p>9b</p>	<p>9b Moss resembles a cedar/pine seedling, leaves long-linear ending in an acute apex with a green, red/brown, or hyaline awn</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Polytrichum</i> page 331</p>
 <p>10a</p>	<p>10a (7) Leaves with up to nine discernable lamellae running down the adaxial side of the costa</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Atrichum</i> page 332</p>
 <p>10b</p>	<p>10b Leaves without lamellae strips 11</p>
 <p>11a</p>	<p>11a (10) Moss is 2- to 3-pinnate 12</p>
 <p>11b</p>	<p>11b Moss is not branched, irregularly branched, or only 1-pinnate 13</p>
 <p>12a</p>	<p>12a (11) Moss is robust, stem leaves are larger than branch leaves, stems have conspicuous paraphyllia, is 2- to 3-pinnate</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Thuidium</i> page 385</p>
 <p>12b</p>	<p>12b Moss is petite, both stem and branch leaves are minute, stems have inconspicuous paraphyllia, only 2-pinnate</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Cyrto-Hypnum</i> page 387</p>
 <p>13a</p>	<p>13a (11) Moss with conspicuous paraphyllia 14</p>
 <p>13b</p>	<p>13b Moss without conspicuous paraphyllia 16</p>
